

## Jackpot Classes - September 19 & 20, 2009, Sussex, NB

**Have a chance to win cash in your AQHA classes!** MQHA thanks the following for providing prize money to add to your usual classes at this show.

**\$500 by MQHA (Poles)**

**\$350 by MQHA (NY Western Pleasure)**

**How does it work?** Your usual classes are offered. Enter the AQHA class you normally enter for the usual fees. Classes will be judged / placed / pointed as usual.

Some classes have cash payouts or Jackpots. If you want a “chance at the cash” which is in your usual AQHA class then enter the “Jackpot” at the office when you enter your class. You pay an additional fee to have a chance at the Jackpot money.

**Not interested** – don’t enter the Jackpot, carry on with your usual entries for the regular show fees posted.

**Interested** – enter your AQHA classes for posted fees. Check to see if any Jackpot classes - added money classes - are of interest, decide whether you are going after some cash and enter at the office. Enter and you are in your usual AQHA class with a chance at cash! **Entries must be received the night before the show begins!!!**

The following regular AQHA classes are Jackpotted.

# 37 - Open Poles - **\$500 by MQHA**

2 Goes Single Judged, Saturday & Sunday,

# 71 – Novice Youth Western Pleasure - **\$350 by MQHA**

1 Go Double Judged, Sunday,

Remember these are regular AQHA classes – All AQHA rules apply.

Payouts are calculated by converting each judges placings to numerical scores (see chart below). If the combined score results in a tied placing a tie-breaking judge will be used. First place ties will be broken.

20% of jackpot entry fees will be retained by MQHA. Payout of jackpot money is based on the combined overall total of the judges placings held as noted.

1<sup>st</sup> place – 38%, 2<sup>nd</sup> place – 22%, 3<sup>rd</sup> place – 15%, 4<sup>th</sup> place – 11%,  
5<sup>th</sup> place – 8%, 6<sup>th</sup> place – 6%
