**MQHA 2023 CANADA DAY CLASSIC ALL BREED
SHOW RULES & GENERAL INFORMATION:**

1. Shows will take place at the Princess Louise Show Center in Sussex, NB. Classes may be held in the indoor or outdoor arena, at the show offices discretion. A warmup arena is available. The cattle penning arena is also available, provided the cattle penning club is not using it.
2. Exhibitors must be ready for their class when the class is called. After the gate is shut, you will not be permitted to enter.
3. **YOU MUST SEND IN PROOF OF INSURANCE (NBEA, NSEF etc.) and a SIGNED WAIVER before the show starts.**
4. **MQHA MEMBERSHIP IS REQUIRED TO SHOW IN FUTURITIES for the RIDER and OWNER.**
5. **Patterns will be posted on MQHA's website at least one week prior to the show.** Exhibitors are to print & bring their own patterns. Show booklets with the patterns will be available for a cost at the show office- must be pre-ordered on entry form.
6. It is the exhibitors responsibility to accurately complete the entry form & for the exhibitor to know the rules, and only to enter classes that they are eligible for.
7. The show office will be opened on Thursday from 1:00pm-7:00pm and Friday to Monday from 7:00am until show day is finished.
8. Stall and hookup bookings information is posted on maritimeqha.com under the events page.
9. Horses may arrive on Friday after 12:00pm. For the all-in fee, stalls are included on Friday night and Saturday nights. Any extra nights will be billed extra at the regular stall rate.
10. As per PLP rental policy, barn and arena lights are to be shut out by 10:00 pm each night.
11. **Entries must be received by midnight on June 23, or they will be subject to a \$20.00+HST late fee. No exceptions. Payment can be made by cheque, cash, e-transfer or credit card. Credit card payments will be subject to a service charge. Payments must be received with your entry form.**
12. Divisions will be as follows:
 - Junior Walk/Jog (Trot) – For riders who do not wish to lope(canter) and who have not reached their 19th birthday as of January 1, 2023. May not enter any classes requiring a lope (canter).
 - Junior – For riders who have not reached their 19th birthday as of January 1, 2023.
 - Senior Walk/Jog (Trot) - For riders who do not wish to lope(canter) and who have reached their 19th birthday as of January 1, 2023. May not enter any classes requiring a lope (canter).
 - Senior – For riders who were 19 or over as of January 1, 2023.
 - Non Pro** – Riders/Handlers must not have earned any income in the past 3 years for professional services of teaching riding lessons, offering clinics, training horses or judging horse shows.
13. AQHA Rules will prevail in all classes as set forth in the 2023 AQHA Rule Book. This includes: Horses showing in Ranch Riding may not show in western pleasure, or English pleasure, no matter the division. Horses showing in Ranch Trail may not enter any other trail class, no matter the division.
14. You may post enter a class up to 3 classes before, except for Futurity Classes. **Futurity Classes must be post entered by the 7:00PM the night before the class. No exceptions.**

15. Please notify the gate person or show office at least 3 classes ahead if you need to scratch from a class.
16. Refunds will not be issued unless accompanied by a veterinary certificate or a doctors note; refunds are subject to a \$40 administration fee.
17. Tack stalls are available at for \$25.00/night in barns 1-4 or \$45.00/night for Barn 5 or double tack. Tack stalls will not be split on your bill. Whoever books the stall will be charged for it. All tack stalls are subject to availability.
18. Do not place anything in any stall that does not belong to you, including your horse, your hay, buckets etc. or your tack. Any unauthorized stall usages will be charged a daily stall rate.
19. Ribbons are awarded for 1st thru 6th place. Ribbons are not handed out in the ring, but are at the ingate to be picked up by the exhibitor. Futurity class ribbons are handed out in the ring. 1st place shall have their picture taken for the class sponsor.
20. Add Back Futurities – 60% of entry fees will be added to prize money. Split: 1st place – 38%, 2nd Place – 22%, 3rd Place – 15%, 4th Place – 11%, 5th Place – 8%, 6th Place – 6%;
21. **Hi Point Awards:** will be awarded for Senior, Senior Walk/Jog, Junior & Junior Walk/Jog. All classes in each division will count towards the high points, as well as points from open halter & open hunter hack.

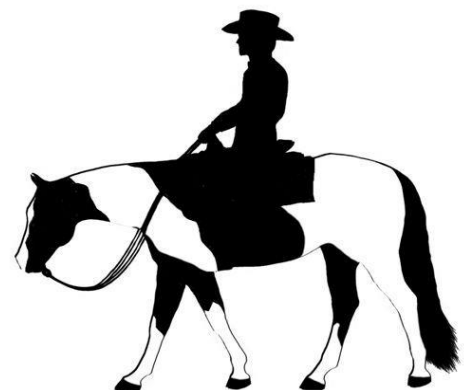

CROSS OVER RULES FOR ALL BREED FROM AQHA

The addition of All Breed classes to our AQHA shows this year is to encourage new people to come out and show, and to provide a chance for Non-AQHA horses to show in an AQHA environment. It is not the intention for AQHA seasoned competitors or horses to show in these classes.

1. No horse/exhibitor combination showing in AQHA classes shall be permitted to show in any All Breed Classes, excluding futurities.
2. An exhibitor may show in AQHA classes AND also show a different horse in All Breed Classes so long as the second horse is not being shown in any AQHA classes by another exhibitor.
3. An AQHA horse may be shown in AQHA classes by one exhibitor AND shown in All Breed by another exhibitor, so long as the second exhibitor is not showing in AQHA classes on that horse or on a different horse.
4. Out of each horse/rider combination showing in All Breed Classes, either the horse or the rider (or both) must not be entered in ANY AQHA classes.
5. Futurity classes are open to AQHA and All Breed Exhibitors. However, an MQHA membership is required to compete in an MQHA futurity.

Examples:

- Sarah is riding Prince in AQHA Youth Equitation. Therefore Sarah can not ride Prince in any All Breed Classes. Sarah can ride her other horse Charley in all breed, but Charley can not be shown in any AQHA classes by Sarah or by anyone else.
- George is showing his AQHA gelding in yearling halter. George is also showing his mare Diva in All Breed. This is allowed but Diva can not be shown in any AQHA classes by George or by anyone else.
- Candace has a registered Quarter Horse but does not feel ready to show in AQHA classes. She can therefore ride her horse in the All Breed Classes. Her horse can be shown in AQHA classes by her trainer Bob, but Bob can not show in any All Breed Classes.
- Thomas is showing his mare in AQHA classes. His younger sister wants to show the horse in the all breed. This is allowed, but his sister is not allowed to show in any AQHA classes on this horse or any other.

ALL BREED CLASS DESCRIPTIONS:

All Breed English

Appointments: Hunter style equipment including balanced seat or forward seat saddle, and snaffle, pelham, kimberwick bits. Martingales and draw reins are prohibited. Mane and tail may be braided in traditional hunter style. No discrimination will be made against a full, unbraided mane or tail. Fitted white saddle pads. No flash or dropped nosebands, no boots or wraps of any kind permitted. Rider attire: Breeches, field boots, collared shirt, riding jacket. Gloves are optional. Young children may wear jodhpurs and paddock boots.

All Breed English Equitation (hunt seat)

Pattern to be posted. Tests an exhibitors ability to ride – not the performance of the horse. Contestants work a predetermined pattern consisting of maneuvers such as changing gaits; travel in a figure-8 pattern; backing up as well as posting on correct diagonal and counter-cantering. Top riders return to be judged as they travel the perimeter of the arena performing gait changes at the judge's discretion. Emphasis is placed on ability to sit correctly, hold the correct riding posture and control the horse on a precise pattern.

All Breed Road Hack

To be judged at walk, trot, extended trot, canter, hand gallop both ways of the ring

All Breed Hunter Under Saddle (also known as English Pleasure)

A class for English riding disciplines in which judges evaluate a hunter-type horse on the flat, at a walk, trot and canter. Emphasis is placed on smoothness of gait, free-flowing stride and willingness to perform.

Hunter Hack

A transitional English class between hunter under saddle and working hunter. Horses are required to perform a pattern that includes jumping two fences. Then all exhibitors are asked for rail work at the walk, trot and canter both directions in the ring. Emphasis is on manner and way of going on the flat and style over fences.

All Breed Western Classes

Appointments: Western tack and any standard Western bit must be used in all classes. A standard Western bit is defined as having a shank with a maximum length overall of 82 inches. Mouthpiece must be round, oval or egg shaped smooth. Standard snaffle bits and Bosals are permitted in any class on a junior horse (five-years-old and under). Hackamore bits, cavesson type nosebands, martingales, and tie-downs are prohibited. Mechanical hackamores are prohibited. All boots and Wraps are Prohibited
Attire: Rider may wear properly fitting protective safety headgear without penalty from the judge. Exhibitors must wear appropriate Western attire, including long sleeve shirt with a collar, Western hat and cowboy boots. Spurs and chaps are optional.

All Breed Halter

Evaluates conformation of the horse. Horses are shown with a leather halter and are traveled before judges so that lameness and quality of movement can be evaluated. Horses are judged on balance, structural correctness, breed and sex characteristics and degree of muscling. Of these, balance is the most important.

All Breed Showmanship

Pattern to be posted. Designed to judge the showmanship skills of the exhibitors. Judges evaluate the grooming and fitting of the horse, and expertise of the exhibitor in presenting the horse. Each exhibitor is required to perform a pattern designed by the

judge with emphasis on preciseness of pattern and degree of confidence exhibited by the showman.

All Breed Horsemanship

Pattern to be posted. Designed to test the horsemanship abilities of riders using western tack. Divided into two sections, riders first follow a prescribed pattern of maneuvers at a walk, trot or lope. Finalists ride as a group around the perimeter of the arena. Judging focuses on the rider's body position, seat in the saddle and ability to control the horse.

All Breed Western Pleasure

Contestants compete simultaneously, traveling the perimeter of the arena, and at the discretion of the judge, are asked to walk, jog, lope and reverse the direction of the horse. Horses are evaluated on quality of movement while staying quiet and calm, traveling on a loose rein. All Breed Trail

Pattern to be posted. Trail class tests the maneuverability of the horse through an obstacle course. Mandatory obstacles include one in which the rider will open, pass through and close a gate (walk/jog may not be required to open/shut gate). Scoring is based on the horse's willingness, ease and grace in negotiating the course. The other two mandatory obstacles are riding over at least four logs or poles and one backing obstacle.

Western Riding

Pattern to be posted. The horse is judged on its ability to change leads precisely, easily and simultaneously, using both hind and front legs. Patterns also include a log or pole, series of pylons and for the horse to change gaits – from a walk to a jog or a lope – throughout the course.

Ranch Riding

Pattern to be posted. In ranch riding, the horse is judged on its ability to work at a forward, working speed while performing required and optional maneuvers. The ranch riding horse should simulate a horse riding outside the confines of an arena and reflect the versatility, attitude and movement of a working horse.

Ranch Pleasure Riding

Pattern to be posted. Horse and rider work at more natural and forward gaits which are commonly used in ranch work. This class encourages a natural headset and extended gaits are often called for such as an extended walk, trot and lope. In this class, the judge(s) are looking for horses that have ground covering gaits that would be a good mount for a day working on the ranch.

Ranch Trail

This class, modeled on the Versatility Ranch Horse ranch trail class, tests the ability of the horse to negotiate obstacles that might commonly be found on ranches. Maneuvers may include riding over obstacles, opening and closing hinged gates, riding across bridges, backing, sidepasses and dragging objects. Horses cannot cross-enter regular trail classes if they are entered in ranch trail at the same show regardless of division.
